Curriculum Implementation

St Mary's curriculum is thoughtfully and creatively crafted to build upon the subject specific knowledge, skills, vocabulary and understanding as set out in the National Curriculum (2014) through rich experiences and enhancement opportunities, stimulating themes and texts, progression from previous year groups and individual starting points and tangible connections between subjects and real life; enabling our pupils to flourish throughout their learning journey.

Clear strategic planning as a staffing team has created a curriculum with explicit progression of skills, knowledge and understanding. These are shared with parents / carers, Governors and other stakeholders through half termly curriculum maps for each year group. Local context of our area, family backgrounds, history, international links and feedback from our consultation have influenced the choice of texts, topic themes and content – providing a rich, holistic and stimulating curriculum, throughout all phases of our school; starting in our Nursery. Pupils have opportunity to influence their learning and are encouraged to share celebrate their heritage, faith and experiences.

Inclusion, diversity and challenge at all levels and across all subjects is fundamental in promoting inquisitive, compassionate, resilient, courageous and creative learners. The acquisition of transferable knowledge, skills and vocabulary is a golden thread throughout our curriculum: weaving together cross-curricular links and learning.

Curriculum Impact

An annual programme of monitoring across all subjects provides triangulation of information, in order to gauge the impact of the curriculum design. Subject leaders are responsible for the monitoring and reporting for their subject and this is quality assured by senior leaders.

As a whole staff team, we work together to reflect upon our curriculum, monitoring outcomes and pupil and parent / carer voice and develop our curriculum for the next academic year; responding to current context.

Our curriculum has been designed to provide our pupils with the following outcomes:
